

Western Washington Center for the Arts COVID-19 Safety Plan
Amended June 8, 2022 - Effective Immediately

In light of changes to Washington State COVID safety protocols, our board of directors has made the decision to no longer require patrons to show proof of vaccination, or of a negative COVID-19 rapid home test, in order to attend our performances.

Masks will still be required for all audience members while inside the theater, except while actively eating or drinking.

Actors will still be required to show proof of vaccination to be involved in any WWCA production and, while masking is not required while performing on stage, it will still be mandatory for actors backstage and for all crew members and volunteers.

Western Washington Center for the Arts is committed to providing exceptional live, local theater and will continue to do so while keeping the health and safety of our community a priority at all times. Our board of directors reserves the right to modify our COVID Safety Plan in the future, in light of new requirements by local and state authorities, or in the event of increasing COVID cases in our community.
